If you want to submit a claim for compensation, here are five steps you should take after a car accident:





Involve the Police

Call the police, even if the accident is minor. The police will make a record which helps to establish that the accident actually occurred and also helps in determining who was at fault.





Get Information and Take Photographs

Get photographs of the accident scene, witness names and contact information. Photograph the vehicle positions, body damage, skid marks and road conditions.





Get Medical Help

A visit to the doctor or hospital helps to document your injuries and makes you eligible for Personal Injury Protection (PIP) coverage.





Talk to a Car Accident Attorney

An experienced car accident attorney will help you avoid any legal mistakes. He or she will represent your interests when submitting a claim for compensation from the responsible party.





Do Not Give a Recorded Statement to an Insurance Representative
